Make an Easter Card!

There's nothing more special than getting a handmade card, so here's a simple idea using handprints to create a very special keepsake.

Remember to supervise little ones with craft activities.

You will need:

- 1 x piece of A4 coloured card (white, green or light blue would be best)
- Yellow paint
- Paintbrush and pot
- Black and orange felt-tip pens

Step 1:

Fold your card in half. Grab your brush and paint the palm of your left hand yellow.

Step 2:

With your fingers facing upwards, press your hand against the card to create a handprint in the middle. Leave to dry.

Step 3:


Using the felt-tip pens, add black eyes and an orange triangle for the beak just below the fingers. Then give your chicken two orange legs.

Step 4:

If you'd like to add some more detail, try drawing some flowers, grass, or even some eggs!

Step 5:

Finally, write your message on the inside.
